



## Preface

#### Azul!

While going through the March 2000 issue of *Wired* magazine, I came upon an article about a "Kingdom of Talossa" and "micronations". It was the first time I found out about the Regipäts, after which, I forgot about it, surprisingly enough. But two months later, I remembered the article, and have not forgotten about it since. And when I read that article that second time, I was bowled over.

Of course, there was the possibility this "Kingdom of Talossa" was some internet hoax or con game. But I figured the journalistic pros at the nationally-distributed *Wired* magazine would have checked things out. Hence, I could trust what I saw on talossa.com and Wittenberg. On 6 June 2000, I made my first post on Wittenberg and my debut appearance on the Talossan stage.

In hindsight, though, I should have read that article more critically; for, as I would come to realize, it was and still is the seminal work on Talossa penned by someone who had never (and still has never) been associated with Talossa or Talossans, Old-Growthers or otherwise, in any way, shape, or form. Alex Blumberg, the article's author unwittingly put in subtle clues to things that would crop up and bite us all four years later.

Why didn't I give that article a closer look? For one, I was wowed by the idea that a childhood fantasy-country-kingdom complete with history, culture, and language could survive for twenty-and-a-half years, attracting and maintaining an audience of active participants. *Ar Päts* seemed to confirm all the fun things I picked up from the article. I checked out Talossa's web presence and found it worthy of further investigation.

With this hopeful optimism and like so many before and after, I made my appearance on the Talossan stage. Some who came to Talossa before and after me were quick to pick up on Ben's other side. For me, it took almost four years. The only explanation I have is that when I first came to Talossa, I was less mature and a bit more naïve than I am now.

Odd that maturity comes to my mind and pen now. Of the many factors that brought on 1 June 2004, I believe the most important factor leading to the Republic's foundation was a different maturity: Ben Madison's. Many in the Kingdom of Talossa had begun to believe that Ben had never really grown up. There was also a general perception that Amy Durnford's overbearing influence had influenced Ben toward more extreme reactions in the 2003-2004 period. The combined effect of the Insult of 26 December 2003 and Amy's previous and genuine domestic violence miseries, added to her absolute loathing of Chris Gruber, made Amy and Ben unable or unwilling to see Gruber's statement as it truly was: a fanciful way of saying "drop dead".

Most of what follows is documented in publicly-available sources, especially Wittenberg X. The central conflict of this period was the growing hatred of the King towards Chris Gruber and the fallout from the monstrous Amy/Chris personality clash that was their first meeting at TalossaFest weekend 2003.

Some would say this document is full of 'spin'. I don't deny that many of my raw emotions from 2004 are preserved here for posterity. Then I was angry. I'm still sad, but resolved to see our community come into a Talossan future as bright as it can be. Hindsight's wisdom and soothing balm has soothed much of my pain.

I made my first post on what was then Wittenberg VI, and my first appearance in Talossa, on 6 June 2000. I became a citizen of the Kingdom of Talossa during the Living Cosâ of Saturday, 5 August 2000, on the same Clark as Amy Durnford. For the first three years or so-until October 2003--the Regipäts was a barrel of fun. Yet for all the frustration and sheer stupidity of the last eighteen months, I have to remember what Talossa has been for me: a journey of nationbuilding, enjoyment, frustration, and personal growth.

Of course in 2000, had someone told me I would be, four years later, helping *Miestrâ Schivâ*, the "Greek God Gny", and Ián Anglatzarâ build a Talossan micronation devoid of Ben Madison, I would have thought that person to be crazy.

On both my visits to Talossan soil (aka Milwaukee, Wisconsin), Ben Madison was a gracious and genuine host who went out of his way to make my stays there enjoyable as could be. Talossa gave me a window into the wide world

around me and an instant circle of friends. Only since Independence from the Regipäts have I fully realized the many positive things Talossa has added to my life. I am a more informed voter, a more tolerant individual, and a better-rounded human being. I have learned a great deal about history, languages, and religion. At the end of the day, it was R. Ben Madison, through his refusal to let Talossa die, who made all this possible for me. That I will never forget.

Why, then, would I leave him? Why would I help found what those still in the Kingdom might term a "faux" Talossa? It was because I come to the realization things had gotten so bad and Ben Madison's behavior had become so unbearable to be around that I could no longer, in good conscience, recommend that others join the Kingdom of Talossa. That's the simple answer, the lightning flash that came after a long story had unfolded.

The saga of my transformation from affection and loyalty for Robert I to disappointment and treason is not mine alone. It is that of every Founding Parent, every former Liberal, every former Penguinean, and every other former citizen or prospective of the Kingdom of Talossa Ben drove off. Since 1997, I estimate there have been around *twenty-five* or so of these individuals.

Just before the Living Cosâ of August 2000, I rang TalossaFest and spoke with Gary Cone and possibly Ián Metáiriâ. It was also the first time I had ever heard Ben's pleasant speaking voice. The first thing I asked him was, "How have you been able to keep up Talossa for so long?" He instantly replied, "Because I would not admit defeat." In hindsight, some of us might say that was Ben's whole problem. Talossan history from November 2002 to 1 June 2004 could be summarized this way: in the end, R. Ben Madison loved his imaginary country and political fantasy more than the friendships and family he had built through it.

Halloween 2003 took place on my watch as the Kingdom's Prime Minister. As someone who played a key, though unintentional, role in the debacle, I feel a duty to tell the true story. Halloween's fallout has been helped me better understand my Talossanity and myself in general. This document is not merely my duty to the Kingdom and Republic; it has been a cathartic experience.

This project began as an attempt to write a 'Big History' of the Kingdom of Talossa for the two-year period beginning at about the end of the Progressive-Conservative-Party 'Pot Pie Blob,' as Wes Erni coined it years and years ago. I soon learned that such a task would take more time than I could spare. The result before you is this more-focused work. It is not a complete day-by-day history of the Kingdom of Talossa from November 2002 onward. It is, instead, the chronicle of the decline of Kingdom of Talossa from a happy community of nation-builders, 'language nazis' and the like to a place of paranoia and mistrust in which the atmosphere had become poisonous.

This is not intended to be the sole, definitive telling of this story, though I have done all I can to objectively lay out the cold, hard facts. While Chris Gruber shares part of the blame for what happened, I hope to show that what Ben did trumped all. At this writing, Chris Gruber himself is working on a very similar project. I pray others will do the same, and that you'll read them as well.

For the record, the following were the main events that pushed me away from the Kingdom of Talossa, (though the first and second items on this list were sufficient provocation for my leaving the Regipäts). This report details them all.

- Ben and Amy's public airing of Chris Gruber's court records
- Ben and Amy's use of these records to falsely accuse Gruber of violent crime
- Ben's attempt by way of 32nd Cosâ, RZ27 to throw Chris out of Talossa
- Ben's callous reaction to Lisagate
- Effectively kicking Art Verbotten, a friend of his for two decades and the 'Conscience of Talossa' in the teeth
- Effectively kicking Bill Cooper, well-liked by almost everyone regardless of political parties, in the teeth
- Bill Cooper's renunciation, an objective statement from a relatively new citizen (who had no Talossan axes to grind, partly due to health problems) on the dangerous precedent Ben set with regard to his prying into Chris Gruber's past.

One should think that in the interest of the smooth flow of the text, I would refrain from inserting into this document Wittenberg post after Wittenberg post. However, I am no Faulkner or Capote. And even if I were, there is no replacement for the players in this drama speaking to us once more -- in their own words. It is true that a lot went on behind the scenes. But, the main acts were played out on Wittenberg for the world to see.

But, please don't just take my word for it. Look through all primary source documents, read others' accounts, and wherever and whenever possible, speak with citizens both in the Republic and the Kingdom and make up your own mind.

As for mine, here it is.



### Boredom





The Traitorous Liberals had renounced their citizenships and vanished. The last bastions of Penguinea, Sauls, and Gallagher were nowhere to be found. And the country could breathe free once more. All was right with the cosmic order. There were no more enemies. There were no more battles. Loyal Talossans had won out, with the glorious victory memorialized in Ar Päts. And the Progressive Conservative Party of the Kingdom of Talossa held supreme power, as it had for ten successive years by way of the votes from Ben Madison's family and contacts as well as a continuous influx of brand-new citizens gravitating toward the party endorsed by the nation's Founder and King and active Talossans such as Michael Pope, Ián Metáiriâ and myself. This combination seemed impervious to all political opposition, able to retain a majority government almost indefinitely.

To understand the history of the Progressive Conservative Party, one must realize that it had long been an umbrellamalgamation of various political threads and interests. In late 2002 it was no different. Indeed, at one time many years before the span of time I am about to share with you, Wes Erni likened the party to a "pot pie blob" held together only by its enveloping crust (L'Oraclâ #10). With no more battles to fight, it had become mainly a tool of political power. That mattered quite a bit in Talossa, for most Talossans' primary interest in the nation was its politics. The Opposition ZPT and RCT despaired of ever breaking the PC's iron grip. The only people really working on *el glelþ Talossán* were Ben and Tomás Gariçéir, with some assistance from Andrea Thompson and Ron Rosalez. Talossa had become a stagnant place where, instead of Talossan politics and Talossan things, the chief topic of conversation was American politics. Such was the Talossa I, as the nation's twenty-sixth Prime Minister, presided over in October of 2002.

In this atmosphere of national doldrums, punctuated by an occasional Válcadác'hian Prime Dictate, Chris Gruber and Tomás Gariçéir had a lark. The Kingdom had a grand tradition of acute fascination with the aesthetic trappings (but not the ideals) of fascism, especially as displayed in the person of Benito Mussolini. Hence...







These are three of the original art photos Tomás and Chris put together in October-November, 2002. There were more, but these rank as among their best. Combine this spurt of creativity with the stagnation caused, in many people's eyes, by the PC monolith, and you have the potential for...well, something.

But before "something" came about, something else took centre stage:

### "F--k America"

Fuck America, They Are Greedy Selfish Fucks Who Deserve The Evil They Elected

Such was future Howard Dean supporter Chris Gruber's reaction to the Republican Party's winning control of both houses of the United States Congress for the upcoming Congressional term. This was the first time in more than fifty years that Republicans had held all three at once. It was nothing more than Gruber's temper getting the best of him.

Most of Talossa, of course, was stunned and offended. Gruber did the only thing he could to make amends: he apologized. The whole thing blew over, even with the most-vocal of critics, Michael Pope and Ián Metáiriâ.

### The Pot-Pie Blob blows up

On 3 December 2002, it happened. Chris Gruber and Tomás Gariçéir announced on Wittenberg they had left the Progressive Conservative Party to form El Parti del Congreßeu Grischún (The Grey Congress Party).

The new party's fifty-word statement, issued that day, says it all about their vision for Talossa:

El Parti del Congreßeu Grischún isch zedicat àl reclamaziun dal Glôriâ Talossán par 'n ceadfâ renoviçadâ dal divertà, dal actività culturál, dal fermità dal taradnà, dal respectù për la tradiziun, és dal eficançù del governamáintsch. Noi volent terminar Talossa së Grült Seriösità, és dûciarhent el vej à'iensâ Renataschâ Culturál Talossán.

Translated into English: "The Grey Congress Party is committed to the reclamation of Talossan Glory through a renewed sense of fun, cultural activity, firmness of character, respect for tradition, and government efficiency. The Grey Congress Party seeks to end Talossa's Great Seriousness, and we shall lead the way towards a Talossan Cultural Renaissance."

The Grey Congress' first step, unfortunately, was directly into the honey bucket. Issued that day along with their fifty-word statement was their Platform. The initial version of Plank #1 was: "We call for a moratorium on the discussion of United States politics on Wittenberg. [Thanks to Chris Gruber for the exact wording of this plank. I do not have an archive of the first version of the PGC Platform]". This platform plank was a direct reaction to the Wittenberg flame war that had broken out over "F--k America". The word 'moratorium' was a horrid mistake, with clear connotations of governmental censorship and direct intervention.

On 5 December 2002 the PC received another blow. That day, Ben Madison and Wes Erni left to bring La Mhà Nheagrâ (the Black Hand Party of yore) back from the political mists. (Lowry 94, L'Oraclâ #12 and #13).

The next day [Lowry 93], the offending sentence in the Grey Congress' Platform was replaced by, "We call for a measure of calm when discussing United States politics on Wittenberg." (Boldface in original.) But the damage had already been done. The ZPT had a field day with this, and the Black Hand, pre-empted by two days by the Grey Congress in its public re-incarnation, now had a new lease on life via the Grey's handing them a free political machinegun.

There are a couple of ways "moratorium" could have been handled. One could simply give the Greys the benefit of a doubt and just let the thing slide, but I am not sure that would have been a good thing. While it quickly became clear that the wording was poorly thought out, any hint of government interference in free speech had serious connotations. Of course, "Moratorium Gruber" became a part of the Ben-lexicon.

It is tempting to say that the "F--k America" statement (and the PC's outcry against it) was the direct precursor to the demise of the "Pot Pie Blob,". It was not. The birth of the Grey Congress and the rebirth of the Black Hand in particular were results of long-diverging visions of Talossa's future. These visions were not, in the pure forms intended by those who had them, likely to see the light of day in the Progressive Conservative camp.

It is easy to speculate that "F--k America" was the beginning of the end of Ben and Gruber's friendship. However, this Wittenberg X post from Grubi bears noting.

[Jeff:] > Thinking of this, the fact that at T-Fest 2003 of his saying to Gruber that he wanted Gruber to become the next King makes sense. Get the loathsome Gruber out of a spot where he could be politically-active. For Ben hated Gruber from "F--k America" onwards... That's when the Halloween Crisis began: with Ben's inability to forgive Gruber for "F--k America". Strange that that forgiveness came from everyone else (except Amy), including Ian M. and Michael Pope!

You've mixed things up badly here. Ben never truly cared about the "Fuck America" remark. He used it when he thought it was politically viable to do so, but he didn't speak out against it as much as some folks like to remember. It was IM who offered the loudest protests.

What ticked Ben off was, before anything else, the formation and announcement of the GCP. He and Wes were starting their own little game off to the right of the PC but the GCP pre-empted his thunder by announcing a day before the MN did. If there's one thing Ben hates, it's people stealing the spotlight from him. And when the GCP came out with an aggressive (albeit funny) advert campaign [Advertgate], he started to lose it. When the PC (when we were both a part) had over 75 adverts, he didn't criticise them once. When the GCP came out with 60 adverts, he howled to high heaven. He knew he and Wes could never keep up with the output that Tomás and I were putting up.

Short answer: I stole Ben's thunder. I usurped his position as the topic of the day.

This is all a part of my book, BTW. Don't make decisions and judgments until you've read it.

## A Tale of two Platforms

The Lytheria Codex, Volume III, Book 3, is the place to read the platforms for the Grey Congress Party and the Black Hand Party for the 31st Cosâ Election, which was held from 15 December 2002 to 14 January 2003. There you will also see the Black Hand's platform. Ben Madison was the party leader, chief architect of the party's vision, and the other members allowed this. At the time, it didn't look sinister. Many of us, myself included, felt that the Black Hand had many positive things in store for the country. Indeed, until autumn of 2003, the Black Hand and Grey Congress never once wavered in their support of my Prime Ministry.

## Advertgate

An election "advert" is a computer graphic like this (Progressive Conservative Party, nicknamed 'Tories,' Cosâ election 2002-2003):



Just a banner ad for display on web pages... That's all: just one example from among the scores and scores of banner ads from many political parties that had graced the Wittenberg stage over the years. The setup was to have a different advert in every screen view/refresh. Thus, the odds of your party's ad(s) showing up were in direct proportion to the number of ads you submitted to the advert rotation compared to all other political parties. Any political party could submit as many adverts as it liked; there was no limit. Such were the advert rules Secretary of State Marti-Páir Furxhéir set up for the 31st Ziu election, held from 15 December 2003 to 14 January 2004, and the Grey Congress immediately submitted no less than forty. The above example is one of thirty-two or so I submitted for the PC, in direct response to Ben Madison's reaction to the Greys' ad frenzy.

While the rest of Talossa gave kudos to the Greys, Ben came out accusing the Grey Congress of intentionally stuffing the ad rotation to marginalize the other parties. The ZPT soon echoed Ben's accusations. Of course, Chris was stunned at this, his Temper burst forth, and another flame war erupted. Yes, Ben and the ZPT were wrong, but let's take some things into account. Though it was later revealed Ben could have gotten as much help in doing ads from J.P. Griffin (who offered) and others, Ben probably did not believe he had that many options, and he probably believed Chris and Tomás knew it. Even so, Ben had once respected Chris enough to knight him in August of 2000. Why doubt his motivations now?

Of course, what really happened was that Gruber and Gariçéir simply got carried away. Everyone else realized this, because they knew the Greys well enough to figure it out. Everyone except Ben...

[Tomás:] > Honestly, it does seem sometimes that once you get an idea in your head, whether it is right or not, you just will not change your mind, ever. Like with "Advertgate" last election -- you never did say "well, sorry, I guess I was wrong about the GCP intentionally stuffing the advert queue with the goal of marginalising the other parties"; it's like that's your story and you're sticking with it, even though it was never true.

Tomás, you knew that by stuffing the rotation with 60 ads, you'd get ten times more exposure than any other party. That's all I said, and I stand by what I said.

This latest war [the fight over the Joint Statement] between Chris Gruber and Ben Madison is disgusting to me as was the adverts war of the previous election. In the previous election a year or so ago, the Grey Congress Party submitted sixty adverts to the Wittenberg advert rotation sincerely believing the rest of the parties (the PC, RCT, etc.) would do likewise as had been done in the past. Tomás and Chris in a single day simply had fun doing the adverts and by the time they came back to earth, they had made about forty. The other twenty, of course, came later. The Black Hand decided that this action was a blatant attempt by Chris and Tomás to deliberatly sabotage the election advertising process by clogging Witt with Grey Congress ads when the simple fact was that all the other parties could have submitted the same number of adverts or more. Indeed, I myself submitted about thirty PC adverts, and Tori Spelling (what a cutie!) got her fifteen minutes of Talossan fame. I sided with Chris and Tomás, and it seemed to me that the Black Hand would see my logic. It did not.

Gruber's reaction to Ben's accusation was fiery, but in fairness, his behavior that autumn must be viewed in the context of difficult events outside his Talossan life. No one but Grubi and Lisa Skovalia knew it at the time, but the chief subject of those events, what Chris called his "Great Personal Issue," had much to do with why Spring 2004 would go down as the darkest time in the history of Talossa.

My Scribe of Abbavilla and my King (who knows more about Talossan law and about the Talossan archives than anyone else ever could) are getting more and more to the point of bitter hatred and I need them both!

The flame war over Advertgate did not abate until the end of the election (14 January 2003), at which point I had a new problem. This one I'd created myself.

# Gruber gets mad again

Gruber's anger in January 2003, just like in November 2002, was temperamental but justified. During the campaign for the Cosâ election, both Chris and I thought that the Grey Congress would get more votes than it did. Long before the end of the election, I told Chris that in the case of a coalition between the PC and GCP, I wanted him as my Deputy Prime Minister. As it happened, the PC and Black Hand (abbreviated with its Talossan-language initials: MN) got enough of a majority between them that they didn't need a third party for coalition. Under those circumstances, making a Grey Congress member DPM rather than an MN member wasn't in the cards. I figured Chris would understand without the need for us holding a conference.

I was wrong. Chris Gruber was angry because I did not include him in any discussions about the upcoming term, though *not* for not being made Deputy Prime Minister. I made my apologies to Chris, all was forgiven, and things were fine after that: Talossan politics at its relatively-civil best. Chris thought the remnants of the PC Pot Pie Blob were still a big, happy family and political brotherhood, even in its sundered state-that the friendships and camaraderie between all of us remained as they once were. No wonder he was angry with me! Ben called Chris's behavior "petulant," and another item was added to Ben's Gruber-Grudge file.

The end of the united Progressive Conservative Party caused my own feathers to be a little bit ruffled. My administration hadn't lost any Cosâ seats due to the breakup, but I hadn't seen the party's fragmentation coming, though I should have. I had been oblivious to the hints of fracture lines in the PC from Chris and Ben. The future of my administration, beyond the next election, was in doubt. I was still enthusiastic about serving, and possibly someday breaking Michael Pope's three-year tenure record of continuous Prime Ministry (though at that time I hadn't finished my first year). I did not, nor do I today, believe I was in any way, shape, or form "backstabbed" by anyone. Indeed, until the Halloween Crisis, the support for my administration from the Grey Congress and the Black Hand could not have been more exemplary.

But something else was going on. I was just beginning to get a hint of Ben Madison's grudge-holding capacity. In the tense negotiations for the 31st Cosâ, in reply to a statement of mine, my PC brethren told me, in effect: "Don't go with the Greys and not the MN. Ben will be your enemy forever if you do. He will never, NEVER forgive you." I had no plans to snub the MN in a coalition just to curry favor with Chris, but I stood duly-cautioned. I also felt at the time that Chris was making a mountain out of a molehill. For the first time I felt the heat of the Temper of Gruber directed at me, and it was no fun, but I was also getting my first sense of the Wrath of Ben.

### The Válcadác'h Coalition

Chris Gruber once said that my term "Válcadác'h Coalition" (for the partnership of the Progressive Conservatives, Black Hand, and Grey Congress) was a bit egotistical on my part. I had not meant it as an ego trip; I chose it because I was in a hurry to name our group, and couldn't think of a better one. My other idea, "Stouffer's Coalition," (Stouffer's being the company that makes TV dinners, among them being several varieties of pot-pies) sounded corny to me and didn't get much support. In hindsight, I think using that name would have been smack-dab in the grand tradition of Talossan humor, but at the time I concluded that it would have given a false impression: that the PC was somehow still the monolithic entity it had been.

On 15 January 2003, the tense negotiations were still underway. The King granted my appeal for a Warrant of Prorogation, which gave the incoming government one extra month to get its house in order, though this cost the new term of government one Clark. It was the first Warrant of Prorogation in at least three years. The negotiations concluded on 22 January. Chris had forgiven me, and I issued a Prime Dictate birthing the Válcadác'h Coalition, with Quedéir Castiglhâ of the Black Hand as my Deputy Prime Minster and Chris Gruber in his traditional role as Minister of Propaganda. The tumultuous breakup of the PC and the most interesting Talossan autumn since 1997 had come to a close. Though it was a new political landscape, the old PC "Blob" was still more or less together and governing as before. The Opposition could only gnash its teeth in chagrined frustration.

One other thing from this time deserves mention. Quedéir Castiglhâ had been an inactive citizen for a number of years and a long-time Opposition "pocket" vote. But in late 2002 or 2003, Ben reached out to him and got him back and into a new level of Talossan activity, and, for a happy change, Quedéir was energetically involved in mainstream Talossan society. He would eventually become an unwittingly-central figure in what was to come and in a fashion even Hollywood could not script. "Q" was a bright new star in Talossan politics, and the lustre of his friendship, kindness, civility, and patriotism shine even to this day.

The new coalition was born, alive, and thriving. One would think this would be the end of the story. But there was something in Ben's behavior in Advertgate that, in retrospect, bothers me: no humor. A sense of humour, even in the worst of times, had long been a constant of Talossan history--even in the dark days of Davron and "fecal logs". The lack of this quirky and quintessentially-Talossan humor and the laughter that came with it was partly what made the coming Halloween Crisis so bitter for all of us. Indeed, the whole thing was downright depressing. At least in the bygone days of Andrew Wozniak, people could snigger about "birds, bugs, and fish"!

But there was something brewing that was deeper than just a political flap. It was deeper than even Ben or anyone else realized. On the surface, it was his growing hatred toward Chris Gruber. But it was more: the beginning of the long and agonizing exit, by many of us, from the cult of tolerance that had come to surround Ben Madison.



### The War debate


In the first part of 2003, what would become the War in Iraq still loomed. It was during this time that Chris Gruber spoke out on Wittenberg against the policies of U. S. President George W. Bush in regard to Iraq. I, Ben, Michael Pope, Ián Metáiriâ and others favoured a war to oust Saddam Hussein. Chris also wanted Hussein out, but he did not believe going to war was the answer.

Gruber's position can be summarized: "Anti-war=Anti-Saddam=Pro-troops." Ben, though, felt that to be anti-war was to be <u>Pro-Saddam=Anti-troops</u>. The King hammered on the point with Gruber. Mentions of Saddam's rape rooms, repression, and torture schemes didn't exactly calm the atmosphere. As the war debate went on, relations between the two grew no more cordial.

Yet everyone in Talossa found a way to get along with Chris Gruber once again.

Everyone except Ben...

#### EM200

Short for "Erni-Madison 200-seat Cosâ", EM200 (a term coined by Chris Gruber) was the cornerstone of the MN's vision for Talossa: returning the Regipäts to what it had been before the dawn of the Cybercit Era in 1996. Volume III, Book 5 of the Lytheria Codex is an excellent resource for a bit of what the debate on EM200 was like.

Under the 1988 Constitution, the Kingdom's legislature was unicameral in the form of a 215-seat Cosâ, 200 of those seats being divided in direct proportion to the results of the general election. The twist was that a single person could hold up to thirty seats at once, thereby allowing political parties a great deal of latitude in distributing votes to loyal supporters and members. For example, if the Talossan National Party received 80 seats in an election, it could give thirty seats each to two party stalwarts, giving to each of then one-seventh of the Cosâ vote! Fifteen seats could go to someone who had been in the party for a little while, and the rest could be handed out to newbies and members perceived to be less-reliable. This minimized the impact of loose cannons, haphazard voters, and the like. This distribution of seats is akin to the distribution of "points" to various attributes of a character in the venerable fantasy role-playing board game *Dungeons & Dragons*, thereby giving the 215-seat system the "D&D Talossa" moniker.

When there weren't many active citizens, D&D Talossa made sense. It also gave political parties a great deal of latitude in rewarding party loyalists. In addition to whatever seats he might have been holding, the Prime Minister received an extra ten seats and the Deputy Prime Minister another five, thus constituting a 215-seat Cosâ.

With the demise of the 1988 Constitution and the advent of the Organic Law in 1997, there came an end to the 215-seat system. This 215-seat system was replaced by a one-man=one-vote Cosâ of 20 seats: the "Real" Cosâ. Ben and others saw this new Cosâ setup as an evolution in Talossan governance, taking into account the increase in immigration that happened once the Kingdom went online in 1996 and the assumption that the rate of incoming new citizens would stay pretty-much the same, considering the post-1996 immigration boom and the Kingdom's growth trend.

The 20-seat Cosâ worked well, but it required twenty warm bodies to make it work. The falling-off in immigration after 2000 as well as the Penguineans' departure in 1997 and that of the Liberals almost four years later were the key factors in the system breaking down. For a long, long-time "ghost" Cosâ members such as Harry and Jennifer Madison with their dubious interest and participation in Talossa stayed on for years when under the 215-seat body, they would have never cast a shadow over the chamber door and you will understand why when the Black Hand rose from the mists of time in December, 2002, the party had EM200 as the centrepiece of its Platform.

There were other considerations. Under the 20-seat Cosâ, each seat was equivalent to 5% of the vote. Therefore, if a party gained 48.0% and had a plurality, it could control ten seats, fully-half of the Cosâ, yet it had not gotten half the votes. However, under the old 215-seat system, that party would have gotten 96 seats, each seat being the equivalent of but .5% of the vote, but if that party was the governing political party in a coalition, it could get at least ten extra seats (for the Prime Minister, giving it nearly an absolute majority). Ben pointed out all these reasons to us, and to me, they made very good sense.

Enter EM200... Under the new proposed system, the extra 15 seats for the PM and DPM would not be making a comeback, but a new wrinkle, not ever seen before in Talossa, would be added to the mix: provincial apportionment of Cosâ seats.

Under EM200 and on the start of the first day of each election, a census would be taken of each province with Dandelions included in the count. The 200 seats would be distributed proportionally among each of the provinces. If, for example, Vuode had 11 of, say, the 55 people in the Regipäts, it would get twenty percent of the 200 seats, or 40. These 40 seats would be divided proportionally according to the voting result in that province. For example, if Vuode had 40 seats and the MN received 6 of 8 votes in Vuode, it would receive 30 of Vuode's 40 seats.

Let's take a look at the election for the 32<sup>nd</sup> Ziu that concluded on 14 October, 2003 (archived from the Talossan Database System):

A careful look at the totals and party distribution of votes for each province shows a sinister side to EM200. Look at the lopsided victory for the MN in Vuode. Low voter turnout combined with lopsided MN support helped this party carry the day in the vote-richest province of them all. And look at the solid performance for the MN in Cézembre, thanks to sincerely loyal Ben voters. Ditto for Mussolini. Atatürk and Maricopa were inconclusive. But only in Florenciâ and Maritiimi-Maxhestic was there significant support for non-MN parties. Take a look at the vote numbers. Under the old "D&D" system, the MN would have gotten 45.45% of the vote which would have translated into 91 (90.90, to be exact) seats, five less than what they actually got.

There was also the spectre of Ben abdicating and becoming a private citizen, thereby allowing him to get into the Senäts. Of course, with the low population Talossa had even at this time, "doubling-up", or people serving in both chambers of the Ziu because of there not being enough warm bodies to fill the 27 seats in the Cosâ and Senäts was a common happening. Imagine Senator Ben Madison holding one-seventh of the voting strength of both Cosâ and Senäts as well as at least five guaranteed "pocket" votes: himself, Jean Williams, Amy, Harry, and Jennifer. He would have more power than he had held since he democratized the country in the early-to-mid 1980s.

However, with EM200, an even-darker spectre presented itself: a Monarch holding thirty Cosâ seats in a vote to override his veto of a bill. This was something I had thought of, but dismissed until Art Verbotten, independently of me, brought it

up. Citizen Verbotten was the one to raise this issue, and only the Verbotten-Madison Compromise--in which the King surrendered his right to vote on veto overrides--made EM200 palatable to Verbotten and other EM200 critics, thereby paving the way for the bill's easy passage at the 12 July 2003 Living Cosâ. As if the spectre of the Monarch holding not only veto power over bills, but a potential voting strength of more than one-seventh of the Cosâ wasn't enough, add Senator Amy Durnford from Vuode, and you have a recipe for trouble. Yet, consider what time this was: early-to-mid 2003. This was before the PC and Grey Congress became the targets of the Wrath of Ben. For "Loyal" Talossan citizens, July 2003 was the best of times. And the chance of EM200 bringing a bit of nostalgia and new excitement to an otherwise-boring and stagnant electoral system was too good to pass up.

### Marti-Páir and "Real Life"

In April and May 2003, Marti-Páir's business affairs took a welcome, but hectic upsurge. He was almost two weeks late publishing the May 2003 Clark. Finally, on 12 May, I stepped in and took over the Clark. I helped Marti-Páir with Secretary of State duties throughout the summer, including the Clark for the upcoming Living Cosâ. It was at that time that I started to burn out on the PM's office—and came to realize just how big the SoS' job was.

But even all of this was supplanted by the new topic du jour.

TalossaFest and its centerpiece, the Living Cosâ, were held on Saturday, 12 July 2003. As we sat around the table at Lytheria eating couscous, talking Talossa, and eating Verbotten's delicious barbeque, who of us and who of us not present physically but certainly present in spirit could have dreamed this would be the last hurrah of the Talossa we had known? Chris Gruber and Lisa Skovalia, his Significant Other, were ecstatic about coming to Talossan soil for the first time; indeed, despite some awkward moments that weekend, it turned into the best vacation either of them ever had.

Ben had long desired to abdicate the kingship. The evening before TalossaFest, but *after* the clash with Amy which I will deal with shortly, Ben told Chris something shocking: were Ben to abdicate, he would choose Grubi as his successor! Chris told me this over the telephone sometime in autumn 2003. It would seem that Ben had forgiven Chris for everything. Apparently he hadn't forgotten their friendship, and how much Gruber had done to rejuvenate the country after the tumultuous days of late 1997 to early 1998.

Or had he? Robert I may have had other motives. The King of Talossa was forbidden to serve on the Uppermost Cort or Senäts. After abdicating, private citizen Ben Madison would be free to become an open political heavyweight. The Senate seat of Vuode would probably be his for the taking, and Chris could be cajoled in nominating him for the Uppermost Cort. As a Cort Justice, he would have veto power over prospective citizens, plus control of one-seventh of the Ziu's upper house. Due to the 1997 Organic Law's exception to multiple-office holding in the case of too few warm bodies, he could also sit in the Cosâ. He would be more powerful than he had been as King since before he instituted democratic reforms in the early-to-mid 1980's. He had even hinted at being in a similar position on Wittenberg VI, back in 2000 or 2001.

Let's stand back for a moment and ponder the exact nature of what went down when Chris Gruber met the Royals for the first time.

With all due respect, he's behaving like a paranoid nutcase, trying to cover his tracks, belligerently wailing at people that didn't do anything wrong, and revealing himself to be a total jerk--something that Amy and I learned through sad experience during his visit here last year, when (among other things) he barged into my wife's living room and ordered her to get off the couch during a Brewers game so he could watch Talossan videos. ("You don't tell me what to do in my own house," my wife said. "Well, they're going to lose anyway," Grubi replied with a snarl. What an asshole!)

With all due respect, I don't think he's the only one.

But I do think we're getting to the heart of the matter here. Apparently, Chris offended you guys at TalossaFest and the psychic wound has been festering ever since. It is extremely unfortunate that Chris does have a way of pissing people off when he truly doesn't mean to. I know, as I been one of those people as have many of my friends. It also unfortunate that it takes people some time to "get" his sense of humor, and sometimes people just don't. The fact is though, that if you really get to know Chris, you'll realize that 95% of the time Chris is just a wise-cracking joker. He's just being silly and there really is no malintent, but it often gets misconstrued because, as I said, people aren't familiar with or can't understand his sense of humor. I honestly believe that's what happened that day with Amy at the house. He was "goofing" in his usual Chris style, but she took him seriously (understandably) because she didn't know him. I just wish you guys would have said something about it at TalossaFest, so there could have been an opportunity to clear the air in person. I think we (Chris and I) both assumed you guys knew he was joking because you didn't act weird or upset about anything after the fact. Now that it's clear that things were not cool afterall, I think this may be the foremost issue that needs to be addressed. Obviously, you and Amy are not obliged to like Chris. But, if you have a problem with something he did, at least let him know so he has a chance to make things right. Believe me, if you don't tell him, he won't know he did something wrong, because he's really not trying to do anything wrong. Then if he doesn't apologize or explain himself, fine...he's being an asshole and I'll be the first to say so!

Anyone who knows Chris Gruber well knows his acidic sense of humor. And when Lisa Skovalia talks about Chris' coming off as mean and insulting when he is actually just kidding around, I believe her. Chris' is a certain type of humor not everyone gets. This kind of humor was something the Royals could not fathom, and when Chris, in his ecstatic excitement and joy at being on Talossan soil for the first time, got into his humor mode, it came off as impolite, and, of course, the Royals were not happy.

Granted, Chris should have toned it down for people who had never seen him in person before. But I now believe since he regarded Ben and Amy as family, he thought they would feel the same way about them, and that the formality one uses for strangers was not necessary at this moment. Chris felt right at home.

It was a personality clash, plain and simple, and a bad one at that.

[Andy Lowry:]> We don't all have to agree on everything, obviously-- what would be the fun in that? But to allow the conversation and debate to degenerate into playground-style namecalling is simply beneath us all. I was especially shocked by Amy's uncalled-for and unincited insults.

OK, let me explain. Amy met Chris on two occasions. One was a pre-TalossaFest lunch date with a bunch of us at a Greek restaurant in Mussolini Province. Gruber kept interrupting her, putting her down, generally giving us all the impression that because Amy was a woman she didn't deserve to speak. Later on, after one of many times when Gruber failed to keep an appointment, he showed up late at our house where Amy was watching the Brewers play on TV. Gruber literally marched into the room, and ORDERED her to get off the couch so he could watch Talossa videos. When she refused, his reply was "Well, they're going to lose anyway."

That sort of behaviour, in person, towards the woman I love, is disgusting and appalling. The man has no respect for other people. That disqualifies him [from being PM].

2003 was just not a good year for the Válcadác'hster.

From 19 September until 4 November 2003, financial difficulties put my second phone line out of service. I visited Witt sporadically, not wishing to tie up my father's phone line, and not at all from 1-4 November. I was extremely embarrassed and did not want anyone in Talossa to know. As a result, I fumbled the Talossan political football at midfield: I told no one, not even my Deputy Prime Minister Castiglhâ, whom I should have made Acting PM until things could get worked out.

[M-P Furxhéir:] > The WHOLE election has Gödafrieu for PM, he WON the election, since 3 parties backed him up.

And, frankly, that was Gödafrieu's fault—he ran an election as head of a three-party coalition that supported him, all the while knowing that he was "burned out" and that he was going to resign during the upcoming term. Gödafrieu (and I think he acknowledged this) should have said so BEFORE the election. You're right—Gödafrieu got 96% of the vote! But that doesn't mean that Gruber has the right to inherit his mantle against the will of the largest party and the majority in the Cosâ.

I wanted to give the Kingdom as much time as possible to find a successor, so I decided not to resign until around New Year's Eve. My financial troubles dovetailed with my burnout to the point where I stopped caring about Talossa. Courtesy to my father was a convenient, impeccable reason to avoid reading my e-mail, checking Witt, or even logging onto the Internet. Had I known what was going down, the Halloween Crisis might have ended differently. Or perhaps not... By 5 November, matters were arguably beyond any human being's damage-control skills.

The explanation for my absence from Witt recently is very simple, stupid, and embarrassing. The financial woes which hit me this summer (Metáiriá knows a little of this) caused me to not have my second phone line which I have used to log onto the internet as well as make my many phone calls to Talossans. As of yesterday evening, this situation was remedied, thereby allowing me to fully undertake my duties as PM once more. I am living with my dad at the moment, and have had no desire to tie his phone line up with Talossan things.

Yes, I should have let all of you know long before this; perhaps Quedéir could have taken up duties in an Acting position for a time. Clearly I have mis-handled the situation.

"F--k America", Advertgate, the negotiations for the 31st Cosâ, the Iraq War debates, and the festering memory of the strife (still not general public knowledge) at TalossaFest... They all added up to Ben's growing animosity toward Chris Gruber. Here is what I had to say about it in April 2004:

[Gödafrïeu:] > While Amy's abuser really *did* abuse her, you have not convinced anyone outside of your family of Chris' having done the same thing. Sorry.

[Ben:] > You don't believe it, so I guess that proves it. The reason you don't believe it is not because it hasn't been proven, but because you are psychologically incapable of admitting to yourself and to the rest of us that you made the wrong decision last fall in choosing him as your PM candidate.

I have thought about that and have come to the conclusion that the only reason he was decisive was because you and Amy did not get along with him last summer and that you are still, because of the genuine loyalty of those who willingly vote for whomever you say, the most-potent voting force in Talossa and that you chose for whatever reasons to make him decisive.

If I had done what was appropriate at the time, I would have made Q the acting Prime Minister while I was having phone-line problems last September and October. Instead, I tried to hold on with my own hands and inadvertently set off the Amy-Ben-Gruber bomb by providing a reason for the two of you to have to work together (the Joint Statement), thereby providing an opportunity for something, *anything* to go wrong, thereby provoking the two of you to wrath.

Had Q been allowed to take up the reins for a while, I could have gotten my bearings again, resumed the government, and perhaps stayed in office for longer than I did. Many things could have been avoided had I done things differently, but your inability to offer any sort of "grace" or whatever when Tomas and Chris withdrew from the Joint Statement combined with Gruber's temper have brought our nationette to the glorious state it is now in.

While I have admitted more than once my mistakes, don't lay this all at my doorstep. Ever since your denseness with the 2002 Adverts crisis as well as Gruber's classic line "Fuck America", the two you have not gotten along. But once you and Amy and Chris met in person, the huge pile of black powder was set, and if the Halloween Crisis had not come about to make the powder [sic] explode, something else at some other time would have. It was only a matter of [sic] time.

### Halloween begins

Oh, my...

Dear friends and readers, it would take at least fifty pages to fully describe the events of 25 October through 5 November 2003. Imagine the biggest email/Wittenberg/phone free-for-all in Talossan history and throw in a tangled, jumbled web of miscommunications, flames, and general confusion. Someday, someone will provide a blow-by-blow analysis of what all went on: who emailed/called/spoke to/cajoled whom, when and why. More power to 'em!

"The Halloween Crisis" is a term coined by Ben Madison for a sequence of crises occurring from 19 October to 28 November 2003. Their common thread was my recent flakiness on duty as PM and my impending resignation. First came the confusion resulting from my decision to resign, then the resulting search for a successor. Through the Joint Statement, the coalition partners had tried to get the message through to me, but it did not register with me until it was too late. Then there was "Seatgate:": a series of honest errors in judgment by SoS Furxhéir, that ended up being forgiven by Gary Cone of the ZPT (Witt X 9220), the de-facto leader of the political party most-affected. Had Seatgate never happened, everything else connected with Halloween and 2004 would have gone right ahead, but it surely added to the tension of the times. The hottest portion of the Crisis was from 25 October 2003 until 12 November. It ended with the King's public announcement of the terms of the Noodles Summit on 28 November 2003.

In the weeks following TalossaFest 2003, I made my decision to resign. I felt a duty to first inform my earliest and strongest supporters, and during the second week of July, I phoned Michael Pope. About a week or two later I spoke with Ián Metáiriâ. After that, I informed the whole PC. We decided to get as much of a Cosâ majority as possible in the next election, then advise the Coalition of my intentions. While this alienated the Coalition, we acted thus out of concern of the growing influence of the Black Hand. A supposedly 'niche' political party, the MN was full of Ben supporters who had long been certain to vote for whichever party Ben endorsed.

For years, that party was the PC. The first PC/MN breach of faith came during the early 2003 Mussolini Senate election, which put Tom Buffone in the stead of the long-serving Matthias Muth. Some PC members felt that the Creator of Talossa was scheming to keep his creation from getting away from him and to maintain control of Talossa EM200 certainly helped that cause, allowing Ben to put more voting power in the hands of his small hand-picked cadre.

#### Who would succeed me?

The election for the 31st Ziu ended on 14 October (see above graphic) with the MN being five seats short of an outright majority in Cosâ. The PC, barely in second place, was not the governing party for the first time in over ten years. Even so, the MN had decided to support my continuing on as Prime Minister. When the story of my decision to resign broke on 23 October, before I was able to put together a proper public announcement, the fun began. My logical first choice was DPM Quedéir Castiglhâ of the MN, who declined because of his horrendous college schedule. In his stead, the MN proposed an unexpected candidate: Maxime Paquin-Charbonneau. Maxime had a checkered history of jumping from one political party to another; he had been a PC member until he left over some anti-Semitic remarks, and his hostility to Israel made him unacceptable to the PC now. The Tories soundly rejected him.

The MN had a problem. The bulk of active Talossans, including the most qualified candidates for the Prime Ministry, were in the PC and the Grey Congress. The PC invited the MN to nominate someone else; they proposed Amy Durnford, whose inactivity and negative attitude toward the Kingdom were well-known. There was also the small matter of her being the Queen, which—while allowable under the Organic Law—was unacceptable to the PC. Finally, the MN offered up Wes Erni, who would have been perfectly acceptable except he had no computer and no Internet access. How would he communicate directly with most Talossans while remaining 'Amish,' as we Talossans refer to this condition? The PC rejected him, citing his Amishness and lack of visible Talossan activity.

""Our logical choice is Wes [Erni] if he wants it," Castiglhâ noted. However, Erni, still the party's titular President, has no reliable access to the Internet and could not really be expected to shoulder the day-to-day management of the Coalition government.""

Tomás Gariçéir and Andy Lowry were discussed by the PC and GCP as possible replacements, but both declined. At the time, I didn't see the hidden message: the most levelheaded Talossans wanted no part of my job. The GCP/PC caucus eventually selected Chris Gruber as my would-be successor. But the MN rejected him. Still oblivious to Ben's festering dislike for Chris (though not for much longer), I was floored.

I did not return to Wittenberg until 5 November, by which time matters were spinning out of control. I wasn't even quite sure what had happened.

The government which I have recently appointed [by way of the 25 October, 2003 PD] is an exact replication of the government from the last term and was appointed and formed quickly and haphazardly to get something in order in time for the first Clark. I see now that was a silly mistake on my part not to let everyone know from the get-go that it was my reason and intent. We did not have a DPM candidate we could all agree on yet, and I needed to do something. I felt that I could not take time to ask for input from the members of our Coalition, but I am also a procrastinator. The makeup of the previous government was one to which we had all assented, [in the negotiations for the previous Cosâ] and I thought I could act as I did without need of input.:-(

From 19 October until 11 November, 2003, I had three different Cabinets. From 19-25 October, I held over the Cabinet from the previous Cosâ term. In hindsight, I now realize many governmental decisions I made during this period of time turned out badly, and I was about to make another doozy.

On the night of 25 October, and I somehow got it into my head that I needed to appoint a Cabinet right then to get a government in place in time for the Clark (which would not be published, of course, until 1 November. Then I thought, "I won't have time to ask people to be in my Cabinet -- Hmm... -- Let's use the Cabinet from last term, and then I can appoint the "real" one in a few days, but at least we will have a government in place in time for the Clark."

And on 25 October, I appointed a Cabinet with the exact same composition as the one for the previous legislative term, with Quedéir Castiglhâ as DPM. Of course, this caused rampant confusion throughout the country as to my successor, given that Quedéir had already declined the PM's job, and this was a catalyst for what was to come. A good number of people saw this Cabinet as high-handed and unilateral. Indeed, even the PC had no input since this was an impulse move on my part! This Prime Dictate was the direct provocation for the Black Hand and Grey Congress' deciding to work together on the infamous...

### Joint Statement

#### "A REAL COALITION"

To the King, the Prime Minister, all Talossan media, and the people of Talossa:

On 14 October 2003/XXIV, the voters in a free and fair Talossan election gave 96 seats to the MN, 48 to the PCG, and 49 to the Progressive Conservative Party (PC). All three parties contested the election together, under the common banner of "The[Válcadác'h] Coalition." And between them, the three parties won approximately 96% of the vote.

On 19 October 2003/XXIV, Prime Minister Gödafrieu Válcadác'h announced that he intended to resign as Prime Minister. As the MN had won a large plurality of the Coalition Government's seats (96 out of 193), the Prime Minister instructed the MN to designate a Deputy Prime Minister to serve in the Government and to take over as Prime Minister upon the resignation of Mr [Válcadác'h]. "It is my belief that the Deputy PMship can justifiably come from no other party save the Black Hand," the Prime Minister correctly observed.

On 23 October 2003/XXIV, the MN dutifully nominated MC Maxime Paquin- Charbonneau (MN-Atatürk) to serve as Deputy Prime Minister. This nomination of a long-standing Member of the Cosâ, Opposition Leader, Senator, and founding member of the former RCT (one of the Kingdom of Talossa's most successful political parties), was met by silence from the Prime Minister's Office.

The Prime Minister's Office refused to comment publicly. Numerous e-mails to the Prime Minister's Office went unanswered. And it was immediately apparent that the only response from the Prime Minister's Office was a number of secret, clandestine attempts to sow distrust and divide the coalition. On various occasions since the election, the MN has been asked to make secret deals against the PCG, and the PCG has been asked to make secret deals against the MN.

The Prime Minister's Office has made cabinet appointments (such as the Deputy Prime Minister and Immigration Minister) an issue of great fog and secrecy, with offers being made to individuals without the knowledge of the various Coalition parties, treating the MN and PCG as minor adjuncts to the "true" governing party, the PC. This sort of divide-and-rule strategy not only indicates, but engenders, distrust.

We, the members of the MN, wish to state publicly through this Statement that we seek only to participate in a Real Coalition for the government of the Kingdom of Talossa. In a Real Coalition there is no room for secret plots, back-stabbing, double-dealing, and double-crosses. It is our hope that we can jointly govern Talossa in a Real Coalition with the PC, MN, and PCG all serving together as equal brother parties.

In order to pursue a Real Coalition, however, the Prime Minister's Office must first accept that the PC won only 49 seats out of 200. It is not the majority party; it is not even a plurality party. It is a junior member of a Coalition Government. Decisions affecting the entire Government are not to be made within the closed-door caucus of the PC without our knowledge, and then imposed upon the rest of us without our consent.

Accordingly, we propose that no day-to-day decision be taken in this Coalition Government without the fullest opportunity of each party to consider that decision, and that each party in the Coalition Government shall have equal say in the decision. Each party must be fully informed of the plans of the Government, and each party should assume a separate but equal status, so that each party—the MN, the PC, and the PCG— shall have one single, equal vote in all collective decision-making, and that the majority position shall always prevail.

In the event that the Prime Minister's Office chooses to treat the MN and the PCG with distrust and contempt, and continues to attempt to isolate and divide them, the MN hereby resolves, publicly, with no shadow of secrecy or attempt at deception, that we shall do what we can under the Organic Law to organize a Real Coalition Government for the Kingdom of Talossa without the participation of the Progressive Conservative Party.

After the Joint Statement itself, the article in Støtanneu in which the Statement was published has this paragraph: "The Grey Congress Party had originally signed the statement jointly with the Black Hand, but on the morning of 3 November, GCP Party President Chris Gruber decided officially to withdraw the names of his party's members from the document." I was so out of touch with Talossa that it was not until I made my return two days later that I got wind of this document.

This will take some time, but we need to get into the nitty-gritty detail of this, for it lies at the heart of a lot of what went on.

Late summer and early autumn, 2003 had yet another thing going on: calls from certain quarters for Uppermost Cort Justices Matthias Muth and Chên Velméir to resign because of lack of activity on Wittenberg and in Talossan society in general (Lytheria 3.1). On Monday, 27 October, 2003, Matthias Muth did just that, though for him, burnout with Talossa in general was a contributing factor. Let's take a look at the Lytheria Codex, Volume III, Book 2, which is a repository for Wittenberg X 7817, the "Gruber-Madison Correspondence" post where Chris lays out numerous emails in his efforts to counter Ben's charges of power-grabbing (more on that in a bit).

Tomás had expressed some doubt to Chris about the wording of the Statement and Chris concurred. On 4 November, the Black Hand party officially withdrew from the Coalition (Witt X 5508) and went into Opposition, leaving me with a minority government of only the PC and the Grey Congress. The ZPT had only seven Cosâ seats and included only Gary Cone and the incommunicado party leader, Chêneþ Velméir. The rest of its members were siding with the PC in protest of Ben's behavior of the past few months. Now this tiny party held the balance of Talossan power, for in union with the MN they represented a majority. The flap over the seven ZPT seats, and the question as to who actually owned them and what to do with them, and how his question was handled became "Seatgate." Chris Gruber was named as Deputy Prime Minister on 9 November.

At the same time, the Black Hand got the impression that either Gruber or I would call for a new election immediately and that I would resign the PMship that very week instead of at the end of the year. Of course, this was not helped by the fact of my inadvertently including the King on an email to the Grey Congress and the PC about my possibly having the government dissolved if the King had vetoed my PD making Gruber my DPM (that's what I get for not paying better attention to Eudora's autofill-address-field feature)!

The following, from my Speech to the Nation of 12 November, 2003, exhibits my state of mind at the time:

There is a phenomena which happens to many Talossans from time to time and it has been happening to me for quite some time, though until recently, I have buried my head in the sand: burnout. I have enjoyed being your Prime Minister and I am proud of the work I have done, but I have reached a point where I must attend better to my non-Talossan life and spend less time on our nationette. The Princess of Prospect was none other than Jennifer Madison, the King's sister, who had not been active in any Talossan way, shape, or form (save to vote when called upon by Ben, assuming he actually even contacted her) since at least the start of the cybercit era in 1996. ## Speech from the Throne 26 December 2003

"Nowhere does the Constitution demand an indifference on the part of the sovereign to the march of political events. Why are princes alone to be denied the credit of having political opinions based upon an anxiety for the national interests and honour of their country and the welfare of mankind? Are they not more independently placed than any other politician in the State? Are their interests not most intimately bound up with those of their country? Is the sovereign not the natural guardian of the honour of his country, is he not necessarily a politician?"

-Prince Albert (1843)

My loyal Talossan subjects,

I come to you this morning with a heavy heart and a deep sense that Talossa has taken a turn for the worse in its twenty-third year. The events of the Halloween Crisis have been yet another reminder of the dark side of Talossa, a pointed indication that there are things in our community that bring out the worst in all of us.

Perhaps what has been most personally distressing for me is the eruption in Talossa of what I can only call American-style politics, or what an American politician once called "the politics of personal destruction." At the risk of public ridicule, let me repeat myself: I honestly believe that on moral grounds, the majority in the Cosâ acted properly when it chose, as it was forced to choose, between Maxime Charbonneau and Chris Gruber for Prime Minister. The kindness, maturity, and grace shown by Maxime Charbonneau, in the face of hysterical and violent opposition, clearly showed him to be the right man for the job, regardless of his past or present views on "the United States and Israel," to quote the previous administration.

The term "vicious personal attack" has become a cliché in Talossan politics. This is a sad thing, for the term needs to have a unique bite in order for it to be meaningful, which I fear it no longer is. Verbally assaulting a person's spouse, attacking a Talossan not over their views or opinions but over their job, their sex life, or their family—those are "vicious personal attacks."

The Opposition's inability to *publicly* criticize its own candidate for Prime Minister, at a time when numerous Opposition members were *privately* assuring me that he no longer enjoyed their confidence or even their personal respect, was exceptionally troublesome and echoed to me Ronald Reagan's instruction "not to speak ill of a fellow Republican." If Talossan politics today will tolerate double standards of secrecy and silence so long as the villain has the right party affiliation, then Talossan politics contains within it a dangerous, cancerous growth.

This sort of stuff is not "fun." It does not keep Talossa from being "boring." It is not a question of principle, but merely one of tactical advantage. The Organic Law rightly states that Talossa is, above all, "a community of persons having fun."

For example, a word about non-candidate voters. Year after year, some enterprising politician picks on Talossans who are not online, who don't attend enough parties, or whose voting record is, for want of a better word, too consistent. When the leader of the opposition contrasts the government's legitimate "popular" support—in other words, its support on Wittenberg alone—with its "electoral" support, meaning something less legitimate, then the nation's commitment to democracy and to its own citizens is very thin indeed.

In no other country on earth, would this even be an issue. This issue must be addressed by our government. Consensus must be found, and enforced. There is perhaps no more fundamental question facing Talossa today: What is a Talossan? Are we a nationality, whose members share an innate, persistent Talossanity for ever? Or are we just an internet club, whose members must pay whatever dues the government of the day requires, or lose their vote? Make no mistake: Attacks on non-candidate voters are unpatriotic, discriminatory, unTalossan, racist, hateful, and wrong. Any Talossan can stay a Talossan and participate in whatever way he or she wants to. I take this occasion to rededicate the Monarchy and the State to this vital national principle, for the sake of *all* my subjects.

To pick on four or five inactive people out of a population of 40 or 50 as somehow cosmically preventing Talossa from achieving its rightful destiny, is the Talossan equivalent of Jew-baiting.

As part of the settlement ending the Halloween Crisis, I offered to renounce my participation in partisan politics. This is another reminder that the commonly held stereotype, namely that I am a tyrant, desperately clinging to autocratic power, is wrong. Reality tells a much different story. In January of 1981 I began, on my own initiative, to give space in Støtanneu to Dan Lorentz and Bob Murphy, at that time avowed detractors of Talossa itself. Within a few months, I had opened Talossa to others as citizens, surrendering my entire "World Singular Secessionist" vision of Talossa as a one-man nation. Elections soon followed, and with them the principle that people other than me ought to form governments and parties.

After December of 1984, I promised elections to the Cosâ, and within a year, I had surrendered my control of the appointed Senäts and made it an elected chamber. In February of 1987, I gave up my royal powers completely and abdicated in favour of King Robert II, a purely constitutional figurehead—a turn of events that was so horrifying to the majority of Talossans, that they forced me back onto the Throne and restored many of my powers.

Those powers, I then proceeded to largely fritter away once again, sharing power in the July, 1988 Constitutional Convention, and giving the Talossan people the power to determine the nation's very fate in the National Destiny Referendum of November 1990.

By May of 1992 I was proposing handing over all my powers to an elected president, legislation that was voted down not by my side, but by the opposition Left. The following year, I gave up personal control of the Progressive Conservative Party, opening it to other members who could soon outvote me on issues. In 1995, I took the initiative in placing Talossa on the internet, which widened the nation for ever beyond my own personal circle of friends and relations. It was not long before the Organic Law was written, in a process in which I was just one voice of many and indeed, a process directed by Matthias Muth, a member of a rival party. Soon I was vowing to sign Dan Wardlow's asinine "peace treaty," bowing to his moral authority as Prime Minister, and offering to leave the PC entirely and let Wardlow run it because of our disagreements. And then I surrendered control of Støtanneu to Chris Gruber (who promptly ran it into the ground after eighteen years of continuous publication).

This past summer, I voluntarily gave up my right to vote in the Cosâ on the override of my own vetoes, and this autumn, I capped it all off by voluntarily proposing my own complete personal removal from the Ziu entirely, something which nobody asked me to do, but which I chose to do myself, for Talossa's benefit. And I have personally drafted an amendment to the Organic Law, which will do just that. You have ratified it, by an overwhelming majority.

And so here we are.

At most of these turns, the initiative for reform, to reduce my lawful powers, has been mine. My entire biography as King has been the constant concession and relinquishing of powers, on the one hand, and the constant refusal to concede one inch on issues of moral right and wrong.

That biography continues today. I hereby resign my membership in the Black Hand Party of Talossa, and I wish my former partisans well in their new identity as something other than the party of the King. Furthermore, I hereby resign my Cosâ seats and encourage the Black Hand to use wisdom in reassigning them.

It is my hope that the Monarchy, no longer encumbered by partisanship, may assume a new rôle as mediator between parties during periods of acute political controversy. This hope depends, of course, on the popular understanding that my concessions are genuine and that my wishes are indeed for the blessings of fate to rest upon the whole Talossan nation. The eruption of partisan politics on this most vital issue would be grave indeed, and I implore everybody to understand and appreciate the sincerity with which I take this unprecedented and radical step out.

Sir Walter Bagehot identified the three rights of a constitutional monarch to be the right to be consulted, the right to advise, and the right to warn. As Talossa prepares to welcome a new Prime Minister as its leader, I invite him, and all of you, to work together with me to guarantee that Talossa is indeed "a community of persons having fun." To that end, as the Monarchy evolves into an independent pillar of government in its own unique right, it is our solemn hope as King that our own consultation, advice, and warning, building as they do on our own twenty-four year experience being a Talossan, might have their parts to play in healing this nation.

ROBERT I of the House and Dynasty of Rouergue, King of Talossa, etc. etc. etc.

This Speech from the Throne was supposedly aimed at fostering unity. Perhaps that was just what Ben wanted his detractors to think. If so, it failed miserably. The Opposition saw it as a Royal temper tantrum. The King's vendetta against Chris Gruber was our chief vocal gripe, but below it simmered a broader stew of discontent. We began to see that Ben had never really grown up from the fourteen-year-old who started Talossa in the first place and that his immaturity was more sinister than the seemingly-lovable and innocent way he had about him.

My November removal from office was seen almost as a coup. At the least, it was a shoddy way to thank me for my service. As for Chris, we saw Ben's rejection of him as an irrational, petulant, immature act based on personal hatred rather than an objective appraisal of Chris' ability to lead. Ben cited a lawsuit against then-PM Gruber, and the lost treaty with Penguinea. So? At least Gruber had not pretended to quit the Throne and his country as a transparent political maneuver—talk about leadership. The PC remembered the fire Chris had lit under the nation as PM from March 1998 to June 1999 and felt maybe it was time for a second Gruber administration. After all, in August 2000, the King had awarded Chris the *Per La Naziun*, the Kingdom's highest honor! Surely Chris must have done *something* right.

However, *Per La Naziun* was then. "F--k America" and the Madison-Gruber wars were now. Like the MN, the Progressive Conservatives were running out of options. The PC knew that Ben might have kittens over Gruber, but the prevailing attitude in the party was "Ben, get over it and grow up.". Throughout the Halloween Crisis and what followed it, the PC felt, even to the founding of the Republic, that there was no rational cause for Ben to have rejected Gruber as PM. Of course, Gruber's Insult of 26 December complicated things (understatement), but that was still yet to come. Enter Prime Minister Maxime Paquin-Charbonneau, whose term in office lasted less than two weeks and accomplished almost nothing. While that term coincided with a bus strike in Max's home town that greatly inconvenienced him, he could have done what I should have months earlier and asked his Deputy to take the reins for a time. He did not.

## The day things took a new course

(It is Talossan public record that Robert Ben Madison's mother passed away in her sleep in 1979, several months before the Founding of the Kingdom.)

The rest of Talossa was ready to let the feud die, but not Ben (see Witt X Thread 5755). What happened next was both inexcusable and provoked by Ben's icy, defensive Speech from the Throne of 26 December. Later in the thread spawned by that cold and remorseless oratory, there was this little gem:

[Ben:] > Then Chris should leave. It would be good for everybody.

For a single moment in time, and perhaps for the first time ever, Talossa was stunned into speechlessness. Even with that in mind, to understand it, one must read the whole of Witt X Thread 7665. The healing has already begun. But it is my humble opinion that the chief problem in this is that you and Chris Gruber cannot get along. I wonder what the next Ben Vs. Gruber election-time war will be about?? The two of you together are a self-regenerating bomb waiting to explode once more -- O joy and jubilation! Chris and Ben are debating again! That being said, I think Talossa *is* big enough and **needs** to be big enough for the both of you, and I hope that you two can settle your differences and move on.

Clearly there were mistakes on the part of many which contributed to this whole thing (in no particular order):

- 1. the love and affection showed between Chris Gruber and House Madison this year at TalossaFest (I refuse to mention any more names that that, but you know who you are.):-/
- 2. The rather sloppy way I installed a government without consulting the relevant political parties -- mea culpa
- 3. Whatever misunderstanding there may have been concerning the Joint Statement
- 4. The whole mess with the scroll bar
- 5. The way I handled the notification of my resignation to the members of my coalition

There have been deep underlying tensions between many Talossans for a long time about [Ián Anglatzarâ], the departed Liberals, the Adverts crisis, Maxime's contreversial views, so-called "pocket votes", the breakup of the PC, and probably other things which I don't know about, underlying tensions the true breadth and sheer magnitude of which I was blissfully ignorant of until I became the nexus of Talossan politics upon becoming Prime Minister, tensions which I was, I confess, not ready to deal with. And frankly, all of these have soured me on Talossa, and your Speech, Your Majesty, does not help things with me. Rather, it brings all the stupidity of this past fall back to me, and posterity will read your Speech and believe me to be some sort of ne'er-do-well head of government who really did not care one whit about his country or his people. Nothing could be further from the truth.

The thing I have learned the most about all this is that mis-steps and mistakes with working the "niceties" of dealing with people is in most cases somewhat inconsequential, but in any sort of politics where the lives of millions of people, the fate of millions of dollars, or even the fate of a community of about fifty is concerned, not dealing with people in "just the right" way, can have terrible and disastrous consequences. I think where this is concerned, we all in Talossa need to have a bit of grace towards one another with this, and I speak to myself here as much as anyone else.

My resignation and, partly, the way in which I handled it served to merely open the pandora's box of pent-up feelings. This was further troubled by the fact that there was really no-one who was willing to replace me who had the broad support of most or all Talossans, though had [Quedéir]'s university told him sooner about his class not being required, then perhaps much of this could have been averted.

It is interesting that, before my resignation came about in the public knowledge of Talossa, Talossa was peaceful and serene, and that afterwards, it was not. It leads me to believe that the time was not right for me to leave. However, the time for me was not right for me to stay on. What a cunundrum. Once I have resigned as Prime Minister, I shall go on holiday for a while. I shall have a much-reduced Wittenberg presence and, in the near-future, resign as SoS Whip and as Maricopa's Secretary of State, contrary to what I have said earlier. I shall also resign my seats in Cosâ, but I will retain my seat in the Senäts and keep my Witt presence to where I can fulfill my duties as Senator. I keep my Senate seat for the sole reason that there is no-one else in my province willing (maybe) or able to take it.

As I said before, I need a break from Talossa "full-throttle", and, additionally, I shall return "full-throttle" when the time is right for me to do so, though I have no more thoughts of renunciation.

I love Talossa the most when I am talking about non-Talossan matters with Talossans, it turns out. WHEREAS, I am a survivor of domestic violence, and want to make sure that Talossa is not a "safe place" for perpetrators of violent crimes, and

WHEREAS, violent criminals have personalities and interests incompatible with democracy, and

WHEREAS, Talossa has a unique opportunity to actually be the "shining city on a hill" by enacting the "zero tolerance" pledges of politicians world-wide against violent crime:

THEREFORE, the Ziu hereby enacts, and places the following before the Talossan people at the earliest possible opportunity as a referendum, as Article XVII, Section 12 of the Organic Law:

Article XVII, Section 12: 1. For purposes of this Section, the term "violent crime" shall include armed robbery, arson, assault, battery, child molestation, domestic violence, mugging, murder, and rape.

- 2. All persons convicted of or subject to a restraining order for a violent crime, in a Talossan or foreign court of law, shall be classified in all official Talossan documents as Violent Offenders. Prosecutions obstructed by defendant's refusal or professed "inability" to be served warrants, etc., shall be considered convictions.
- 3. Violent Offender status is incompatible with good citizenship. The Talossan citizenship of all Violent Offenders shall, upon receipt of legal documentation by the Uppermost Cort, be null and void.
- 4. Violent Offenders may (re)apply for Talossan citizenship, but their applications must include a detailed confession of their violent crimes, with all applicable legal documentation appended, and the Cort and Ziu may take their Violent Offender status into account when voting on them.

#### Order dismissing temporary injuction.

Jennifer Mohney apparenrently had resquested a temporary injunction agaisn't Mr Gruber, citing domestic violence. In Florida, such an injunction is automatic upon request until a permanent one is issued in the courts.

When in front of the court, Mrs. Mohney requested withdrawel of the injunction. No record indicate any other actions pressed by Mrs Mohney against Mr. Gruber.

#### Misdeameanor

- Petty theft, to much Gruber pleaded no contest.

This is the charge that he claims to have made while homeless.

He was NOT found guilty, but rather, the sentence was withheld.

This means, if it is the same as in Québec, that the Judge agreed to NOT declare him guilty but simply to fine him, because the offense was too small to condemn him, and that it was a first offence.

If like in Québec, this doesn't make the accused guilty, and in fact, you can be sued for Libel if you say that such a person is guilty of the crime, since he is not.

Actually if you look under the Summary, Dockets, Dispositions, and Costs tabs, you will see that this was an "indigent" case, that the first event on the docket was the plaintiff's filing of an "affidavit of insufficient funds" (which is all you have to do in Florida to get a free injunction), and that the injunction filing fees were dismissed fees were dismissed because they were "Paid by: LEON COUNTY." Thus, the plaintiff did not have to spend any of her inheritance to pay for this injunction.

And as I keep pointing out, but no one will respond to, here are the criteria for filing various types of injunctions and I see nothing that says a domestic violence injunction requires an act of violence or a threat of violence to have been committed. I assume that for an injunction to be made permanent, there would need to be some proof of violence, but I just don't see where that is a requirement to file for a temporary injunction.

From the Leon County clerk of Court's website:

What is an injunction?

An injunction is a court order, also referred to as a restraining order, that directs a person not to have any contact with you.

What are the requirements for filing a Petition for Injunction?

For domestic violence, this action is available if the respondent presently resides with you, or has lived with you in the past as a member of the family, such as a spouse, former spouse, person related by blood or marriage, person who has lived together with you as though he/she were your spouse, or person with whom you have had a child, even if you have never lived together.

For repeat violence, this action is available if you have been a victim of assault, battery or sexual violence by the respondent at least twice within the past 6 months. The following conditions should also be met: (1) you and respondent are not related by blood; (2) you and respondent have no children together; and (3) you and respondent have never lived together.

For sexual violence, this action is available if (1) you have reported the sexual violence to a law enforcement agency and are cooperating in any criminal proceeding against the respondent, and (2) the respondent who committed the sexual violence was sentenced to a term of imprisonment in state prison and the term of imprisonment has expired or is due to expire within 90 days following the date the petition is filed.

For dating violence, this action is available if you and respondent have, or have had, a continuing and significant relationship of a romantic or significant nature, which is determined based on consideration of the following factors: (1) The dating relationship existed within the last 6 months; (2) the nature of the relationship is characterized by the expectation of affection or sexual involvement between the parties; and (3) the frequency and type of interaction must be based on the parties involvement over time and on a continuous basis during the course of the relationship.

Where can I obtain an injunction?

During normal working hours, the Petition for Injunction should be filed with the Family Law Division of the Clerk's Office, Room 153, Leon County Courthouse. There are currently no costs associated with injunctions.

I only know for Indiana, but I assume that they're basically the same as Florida's, given the information on the Leon County Website. In Indiana, a person need only allege fear the individual will do harm to them for a temporary injunction to be provided. However, a court date is set, and the individual requesting the injunction \*must\* appear in court and give proof that the injunction is necessary. Failure to appear in court, or provide sufficient information for the judge to feel the injunction is necessary, negates the injunction.

The idea that an allegation holds the same legal weight as an injunction granted following appearance in court and proof provided the judge, is ridiculous in the extreme. Yes, there are women who are battered, but there are also false allegations aplenty when no proof is required for the initial injunction. I know, I've seen them. Having had a majority of weomen in my employ over the years, I've seen more than a few of them, both true and false. It is up to a sitting judge to issue an injunction based on facts....not conjectures. Ben is not a sitting judge and has only tenuous information yet is jumping to some really juvenile conclusions.

BTW, in the state of Indiana, an legal injunction issued by a judge, need only have certain methods tried to contact the person the injunction concerns, the injunction remains in legal force regardless of the individual's notification of the injunction, this is to protect the individual who filed the injunction.

If Ben ghost-voted like this for Harry Madison in the Senäts, even with Harry's full consent, it stands to reason that he could do the same in a general election. - 3) You can send an email to sos[at]Talossa.net, but like a phone message, I will need to confirm your vote by calling you within 7 days of the end of the election.
- Proxy voting is NOT allowed.
- Parties who register will need to each pay the ammount of 5\$ US to help me pay the long distance fees (both incoming and outgoing) as allowed in the organic law. I will provice payment instructions at a later stage. Paypal is preferred, but I will accept other methods.
- I remove Ben Madison as Deputy SoS, and will not hire a Deputy SoS. This means every vote must go thru me personally. Should I become incapable of performing my duties, I have already contacted someone to be my Deputy and will announce it in time.
- The current population census is now official.
- Every single electoral system in the world provide a deadline to register for the election. Everyone CURRENTLY a citizen will be allowed to vote (include Marc Moisan). Anyone gaining or regaining citizenship after this post will not be registered for the election.
- Referendums will be lister later on.
- The election process is not officially begun. Parties can register.

Ballot that come after the end of the election will not be accepted, as it always been the case.

It is my belief that the procedure is easy to follow, and totally safe.

Electiongate ultimately did not help things except to assure the fairness of the election to come. But it also sowed more controversy, and was met with derision from various quarters including the Royals and Chên Velméir, who would boycott the election rules by way of a "sit-in": voting by way of Wittenberg instead of by the SoS' prescribed methods.

But I digress.

### A view from Abbavilla on 14 April 2004

Anger... Suspicion... And an all-encompassing cloud of depression... Such was what the average Talossan citizen was in the midst of on 14 April 2004 - up to his ears. No one was talking about the glelp. No one was caring about the mystical Berber heritage. Even Støtanneu was not publishing. Oraclâ magazine was, but its valiant attempts at injecting a little cheer into the nationette failed.

Anyone who sided with Chris Gruber in any fashion, even if said person condemned Chris's vicious verbal antics, was considered by the Royals as being a lesser being than an insect. To this day, there is no record of Ben ever attempting to make amends with anyone involved. All apologies, reconciliation attempts, and so forth came only from the PC and the Grey Congress. And to its eternal credit, even the Black Hand Party, from which the King resigned in his 26 December Speech from the Throne, tried to make peace and reconciliation partly in the guise of

### The Table of Abbavilla



The Table was an email discussion list mandated in a Speech to the Nation (Witt X 10260) on 14 April 2004 by Prime Minister Quedéir Castiglhâ. It eventually included himself, Ben, Chris, Gödafrïeu, Michael Pope, Gary Cone, and Martì-Páir Furxhéir. Ián Metáiriâ was to participate in an advisory role. The Table was meant to bring the key players together and forge a bone fide peace.

As a precursor to discussions, Q (pictured at left in about late 2002) asked each Member to submit his comments and thoughts about the cause of the situation, and what each hoped the discussion might achieve. Q would then use all of these to fashion an agenda, from which he would moderate the talks. Gödafrieu Válcadác'h (see Oraclâ No. 50) and Martì-Páir Furxhéir quickly submitted their statements, but the rest did not. It is highly likely that the rest of the group was waiting on what Ben would do.

They, the rest of us, and indeed, the world are still waiting. Ben did nothing. He submitted nothing. He had already given his spin on the Halloween Crisis in the January 2004 Støtanneu (Lytheria Vol. III, Book

1), and that was apparently that. He showed no interest. Because of this, the Table of Abbavilla never got off the ground. On 12 May, by way of Witt X 11417, the Prime Minister officially scrapped it:

Here are my thoughts concerning scattered Witt posts and emails:

M-P and Ben: Your issues are not my problem. Ben, I'll sack M-P when he pisses me off or does something illegal. He hasn't done either yet. M-P, if you're tired of Ben doing or saying things, YOU do something about it. I'm going to need concrete proof (yes, that includes names if need be) from both of you regarding your allegations before I step in again.

MN party leadership: While Wes is the titular head of the party, I am the de facto leader. Think of me as the MN Shogun. \*I\* make the executive decisions.

M-P's statement to the Table: I told you I looked it over. What do you want, a critical essay review? What I didn't say about it is just as important as what I did say. If I had any issues with it, you'd know.


The Table: it isn't working. I wrongly assumed that everyone would take it seriously. Instead, people are still taking potshots on Witt. So I'm officially putting an end to it. I've too slowly come to the realization that rehashing everything isn't going to work at all. No surprise, since it isn't even what I wanted to do in the first place, yet I at least had to try something at the time.

Some thoughts (Witt X 11417) posted by [Quedéir Castiglhâ] on May 12, 2004 - 13:08

The fact that we seceded from the Kingdom on Quedéir Castiglhâ's watch still pains us. Quedéir is a loyal Talossan in the best sense of the word. He loves his nation; he showed that love with his efforts to keep it together. I've never heard anyone question his integrity, kindness, candor, or statesmanship. The task of bringing things back together again was beyond anyone. Not even a Prime Minister Dan Lorentz or Ián Metáiriâ could have pulled it off.

We had no more options. Ben still had a large base of support among inactive Talossans—who innocently (and conveniently) still trusted Ben to the point of being beyond anyone else's influence--but his credibility with the rest of us was shot. Nothing in our power could give us enough votes to act against Ben, his bloc of silent 'pocket votes.', and the no-votes we felt would surely come from those in the "neutral" faction (Dan Lorentz, Gary Cone, etc.). I don't have the time or emotional energy to have to be continually defending Chris from so many vile and ridiculous attacks, which he takes very personally and rightly so. We have a lot of very serious real life problems to deal with right now, and we really don't need shit from the land of make believe being flung at us too. But Ben has to keep digging things up (literally and figuratively) because he's a spoiled man-child that can't let go until he gets what he wants. I see now, that he won't back down no matter what and that he will dump long time friends if they will not give him his way. Those of you who are condoning such behavior should be extremely ashamed of yourselves - at the very least! Thank God, Chris has returned and he is unharmed, physically anyway. Emotionally, however, he's really been through the ringer thanks to many of you. You all know who you are, and to those of you I bid you a not so fond go to hell.

#### At last

On Wednesday, 19 May, 2004, Michael Pope presented the Progressive Conservative caucus, Chris Gruber, and Lisa Skovalia with a document he had written on a lark that morning: the Compact. It was meant to be the codification of everything we had been talking about doing recently. It was also Michael's way of bringing organization and purpose to our debate. The Compact dealt with secession; the idea wasn't new, but the audience was now much more receptive. Our consensus was that we wanted to chuck King Robert I and the Monarchy, but we still loved the idea of the Talossan nationette, *el glhep Talossán*, and maintaining friendships with everyone else in Talossa. Ben's tyrannical behavior, and our anger at it did not detract from our desire to remain *Talossan*. We felt that Ben Madison had forfeited his right to be a leader of Talossans. He was no king of ours anymore.

Did we have a legitimate claim on Talossan history, culture, and institutions? The first major Talossan mass departure had been that of Penguinea in late 1997. Miestrâ Schivâ, a former Penguinean, recalls she and her fellow Penguineans didn't feel that their short Talossan tenure gave them a valid claim on anything at all Talossan; hence, their failed attempt at their own language and culture. Our case was rather different. On 19 May 2004, only two of us soon-to-be Founding Parents had been Kingdom citizens for less than three years (Andy Lowry and Lisa Skovalia). Most of us had put incredible amounts of time and energy into Talossan activities, including serving in many leadership positions including, in the case of Chris Gruber, Michael Pope, and Gödafrieu Válcadác'h, continuous service as Prime Minister of more than five years. My estimation is that, among us eleven Founding Parents, we had about thirty years of collective Talossan experience, outdistancing even the experience of Ben Madison and the actual age of the Kingdom! We believed we had a valid claim to Talossan cultural legacies and institutions, so long as we gave due credit to Ben Madison. In particular, he deserved (and deserves still, of course) credit for the invention and primary cultivation of the glhep. We wanted to keep what was good and chuck what was bad.

We elected to secede, and call our new nationette The Republic of Talossa.

This decision answered one question and spawned a dozen. Which provinces and territories should we claim? Vuode, Ben's own stomping grounds and the location of the smelly Vuode Beach (near a wastewater treatment plant or somesuch), was out of the question. We nixed Mussolini, even with Muth's 99-year lease on leadership, as strong "Benite" country. Atatürk was unrealistic because it contained the city of Abbavilla (aka the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee), it being the national capital and about as Kingdom-esque as a place could be outside of Vuode. It was also a hotbed of pro-Ben/neutrality sentiment. In the end, we chose the provinces where we either had a majority of the citizenry (as in Maritiimi-Maxhestic), had people in provincial leadership or representation, or both. We ended up with Maritiimi-Maxhestic, Maricopa and Florenciâ. Just because we liked the place—and with an eye toward the return of Ián Anglatzarâ and other Europeans—we made Cézembre the fourth.

In the Compact, we agreed to renounce our citizenships in the Kingdom and form the new country. In so doing, we committed High Treason against the Kingdom. We decided to declare Independence on 1 June 2004. We ratified a Provisional Constitution on May 31, 2004, and decided that a Proclamation of Independence would be the method by which would promulgate the Provisional Constitution and our renunciations. At the same time the Provisional Constitution was ratified, Michael Pope was elected as the first Dean of the Provisional Governing Council and our first Head of State.

On Wednesday, 1 June 2004 at exactly Noon TST, we waded ashore on the far bank of our Rubicon.

The Republic of Talossa was born.

The new Proclamation of Independence for Talossa

In Unity, hereby dedicated and signed 1 June 2004

The unanimous Declaration of the Provisional Government of the Republic of Talossa,

Whereas in the history of the sovereign nationette of Talossa we have long endured the foibles of our royal family, from quirky ancient histories to multiple miniature "revolutions", through Gloria Estefan revivals and street-naming, one thing has gone long untouched, unseen, unspoken: the king is incapable of allowing true

alternate opinions from forming and taking shape within Talossa's borders, both physical and electronic. It is the right of Talossans everywhere to keep and preserve their peace, their liberty, their freedom, and, as such, we Talossans hereby stand together as one, united in our assertion that Talossa is a great community, much greater than the sum of its parts; a community wrought not by one man, but by all Talossans everywhere, throughout her history; a community that will survive on the blood, sweat, and tears of her people for-ever.

When we cast a glance upon our beloved nationette, where fair freedom we have long enjoyed, sorrow fills our hearts to behold her struggling under the heavy load of oppression and tyranny. But when we extend our sight a little farther, and view the iron hand that is lifted against us, behold it is our king; he who, by his oath and station, is bound to support and defend us in the quiet enjoyment of all our glorious rights as free Talossans. We Talossans hereby declare that we are a free people and a free community and, above all, a free nation dedicated to Talossan ideals through actual freedom, not a form of bound and restricted freedom maintained by a tyrant. We cry 'Tyrant!', for the king has acted most unjust in his own manner, seeking to harm those with whom he is in disagreement.

In the pursuit of a singular agenda to drive out all who oppose him in any strong fashion, the king has, especially recently, decided to circumvent every law and tradition Talossa has ever had concerning the safety and welfare of Talossan citizens.

A few years ago, the question of independence from the monarchy would have put us into a surprise, and, we apprehend, would have been treated with the utmost contempt. We then looked on ourselves happy in being subjects of the king of Talossa. We have always looked upon it as our duty, as well as our interest to defend and support the honour of the crown of Talossa, and we have always done it, counting ourselves happy when in the strictest union and connection with our monarchy. However, in all provinces, existing by compact, protection and allegiance are reciprocal; the latter being only due in consequence of the former. The history of the present king of Talossa is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute tyranny over these provinces. To prove this, let facts be submitted to a candid world.

Whereas, Robert Rouergue, king of Talossa, in violation of the principles of the Talossan organic law, and of the laws of justice and humanity, has, by an accumulation of oppression unparalleled in our history, excluded the inhabitants of Wittenberg from his protection;

- He has investigated the pasts of various individuals, both citizen and prospective;
- He has accused citizens not only of committing crimes in Talossa, but of committing crimes outside Talossa, including violent crimes and he has offered no evidence to prove such crimes, but seeks to tarnish any reputation each Talossan has earned on their own;
- He has sought to drive citizens out of Talossa;
- He has sought the passage of bills of attainder, specifically targeting Talossans;
- He has instilled a horrid sense of suspicion amongst the Talossan citizens;
- He has refused his assent to laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good;
- He has conspired to work against other parties while laying accusations of conspiracy against these parties;
- He has refused to appoint a prime minister until installing his own long after the prescribed legal
- deadline and he has refused to follow the law of the land by announcing the continuation of the incumbent;
   He has obstructed the administration of justice, by refusing his appointment of valid justices;
- He has sought a means by which he may circumvent the proper election laws;
- He has cast aspersions at the characters of democratically elected leaders;
- He has inexorably determined upon the ruin of our liberties;
- He has conspired to oust legitimately placed officials of state;
- · He has acted in a manner of inconsistency, claiming illegality of actions he has previously supported;
- He has been complicit in sedition, and did overthrow a legitimate government;
- He has rescinded on promises of appointment to position for citizens;
- He has sought to remove the citizenship of Talossans through every means, including those means extra-Talossan;
- He has committed to the fraud of an electorate by casting illegal votes in the name of others;
- · He has sought to harm the binds of friendship between Talossans by scheming to create allegiance to him and his station against all others;
- He has offered only puppets of state in the stead of popularly elected officials;
- He has accused many Talossans of crimes of treason, declaring that we are not Talossan, but traitorous;
- He has made himself unavailable to the officers and affairs of state;
- · He has sought to re-write Talossan history by laying claims of illegality and impropriety where none existed;
- He has vowed never to offer reconciliation or to assent to such reconciliations;
- He has threatened the welfare of Talossan citizens, upon the arrival of certain citizens to these shores;
- He has exacerbated our calamities, by declaring that he will show us no mercy until he has reduced us;

A monarch whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a tyrant is unfit to be the ruler of a free people. We have sought to end all hostility through civil and determined means, through legal redress, and through simple dialogue, and all avenues before us have been trampled thin with the hostility that has been shown by the crown. He has blatantly refused to co-operate with any Talossan who does not support his agenda of hatred.

As a result of the actions of the king, we are obliged, by necessity, and it becomes our highest duty, to use every means, with which we have been furnished, in support of our invaluable rights and privileges; to oppose that power which is exerted only for our destruction.

Be it enacted by the authority of the people that Robert Rouergue is hereby deposed from the kingly office within this government and absolutely divested of all its rights, powers, and prerogatives; and that he and his descendants and all persons claiming by or through him, and all other purposes whatsoever shall be and for-ever remain incapable of the same; and that the said office shall henceforth cease and nevermore either in name or substance be re-established within this Republic.

We the delegates of the people of Talossa do declare that the King of Talossa has violated his inherent compact with this people, and that they owe no more allegiance to him. The measures still pursued against Talossa leave no room to expect such an interposition from motives of goodness and affection. King Robert the First has manifested deliberate enmity towards us and, under the character of a parent, persists in behaving as a tyrant, and so we renounce allegiance not to Talossa but to him, personally, forever.

We declare the right of the people of Talossa to the ownership of Talossa, and to the unfettered control of Talossan destinies, to be sovereign and indefeasible. The long usurpation of that right by a corrupt monarchy has not extinguished the right, nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Talossan people. In every generation the Talossan people have asserted their right to national freedom and sovereignty. Standing on that fundamental right and again asserting it in the face of the world, we hereby proclaim the Talossan Republic as a Sovereign Independent State, and we pledge our lives and the lives of our comrades-in-arms to the cause of its freedom, of its welfare, and of its exaltation among the nations.

We, therefore, the representatives of the free provinces of Talossa, in general agreement, assembled, appealing to the will of the people for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the name, and by the authority of the good people of these provinces, being Maritimi-Maxhestic, Cézembre, Maricopa, and Florenciâ, solemnly publish and declare, that this free Talossa is and of right ought to be a free and independent state; that it is absolved from all allegiance to the crown, and that all political connection between it and the House of Rouergue, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as a free and independent state, it may establish a free government, devoid of monarchist trappings, devoid of feudal relationships, devoid of tyranny. And for the support of this declaration, we mutually pledge to each other our time, our effort, and our dedication.

We, the people of Talossa, have grown weary of what the Kingdom has become recently. We all feel Talossan in our hearts, and love our nationette, but we do NOT love what it has become, and what it promises to continue as, under the rule of King Robert I.

For the past several months, we have been under constant fire for not turning our heads and allowing the King to run roughshod over the rights of our fellow citizens. Since the "Halloween scandal" a persistent stream of vitriolic fire has been aimed at anyone associating at first with the GCP, and then eventually with Chris Gruber. The GCP decision not to back the MN after the last election is what set this fire ablaze. All of this stems from a royal defeat in the political arena.

While Gruber has repeatedly apologized for certain nasty comments he made in the heat of the political battle, and while he stayed silent from January to April, the King has maintained a negative campaign of hate that has simmered since last December. In his desperation to achieve political support for his public shunning, he funded a private investigation of Mr. Gruber's personal life - a shocking violation of the privacy of a fellow citizen, and an unprecedented abuse of royal power. And while the King conspired to violate his promise and aid one party over another, he made baseless accusations toward the opposition parties of conspiracy and fraud.

The King has made no effort to extend an olive branch to factions other than his own. He has clearly demarcated a line between those who support him (who he calls Loyal Talossans) and those who oppose him politically. This is inconsistent with the democratic principles on which Talossa is founded and in which we all believe. And this is a very bad portent for the future for anyone not currently in the King's good graces.

It is clear that the King will not keep agreements he has made. It is clear that the King will lie when it advances his agenda. And It is clear that for the past half-year that King Robert has done nothing to build this nation, but rather has done everything in his power to drive certain individuals out of Talossa, heedless of the fact that his actions have caused renunciations from devout citizens, destroyed long term friendships which are the core of this country, and infringed on the personal lives of its citizenry in a way that goes far below the lowest common denominator ever imagined.

We are tired of the hate and its source is with one person.

We are tired of King Robert the Worst

We, the concerned people of Talossa, are hereby founding the Republic of Talossa, where we can pursue the vision of a democratic nationette, the vision shared by all Talossans but frustrated by the King. In founding this Republic, we do not want to exclude any of our fellow citizens, with whom we are tied with bonds of shared nationality and honor. ### Gödafrieu's part in this drama

In my Preface, I admitted that playing a key, albeit unwitting, role in all that went on. As Prime Minister, I was a restraining influence. ### What's the big deal, anyway?

As someone recently put it on Wittenberg, evidence suggests that Ben Madison is a "Jekyll-Hyde" personality. I have met him in-person, and each time, he could not have been more gracious and polite - going out of his way to ensure I had a good time - the perfect host. Only online, without in-person contact, does he seem to get nasty. Our Talossan sandbox is a pretend world. Yes, there is *el glhep Talossán* of about forty thousand words (as of this writing), built and crafted mostly by the tremendous linguistic scholarship of R. Ben Madison. That's part of his legacy; the other, and most important, is the community of real and breathing human beings scattered to the four corners of the globe. He founded this community; he later hammered on it until it broke asunder. There have always been conflicts and disagreements in Talossa over politics (Talossan and extra-Talossan), among other bones of contention, but always before the 'fighting' was limited to traditional, benign, and *Talossan* methods: the telephone, the printed word, email, chat clients, and our various Internet discussion forums. There was always that fine line known as *common courtesy*.

Ben didn't just cross that fine line. He obliterated it.

Common courtesy dictates that I do not look for the marriage records of, say, Andy Lowry. Those are none of my business. Imagine we were in Andy's home. He invites me into his living room. It's not untoward for me to look around at whatever stuff he has hanging on the wall, or at his bookshelf. Do I have the right to dig around in his hallway or bedroom closet? Not unless he invites me to do so. Thus it is with Talossa. That which a Talossan makes the business of others, that's a fair topic for discussion. In Talossa, we *trust* each other to keep out of each other's private rooms, be they file cabinets, pantries, garden sheds, or wherever. A man's bedroom is supposed to be his castle.

And this brings up the logical and burning question: Did Christopher C. Gruber ever truly make bona fide death threats against Ben Madison? The notion is ludicrous and utterly abzurd. Chris chose an elaborate way to say "drop dead." Millions and millions of speakers of the English language around the world have used that expression without standing accused of threatening harm. At the very worst, it could mean a hope for someone's demise—not admirable, but not a death threat.

Ben was wrong, so wrong that it made moot every nasty thing Chris Gruber ever said to him.

Dear reader, are you lucky enough to have one person outside your blood relatives who would take you in should you become homeless? I hope you are. For Ben Madison, Art Verbotten was that kind of friend. In a figurative sense, Ben spat in his face. Two decades of friendship, vanished in a sustained storm of Wrath.

The judge told her that she had to return Mikey to me immediately; he specified that she take him to school the morning of the 10th (today) since she had kept him out of school too long and was claiming to home school him (despite the fact that the state of FLorida requires a teacher's certification before homeschooling is allowed; she doesn't have one), and I would pick him up after school.

Well, glory be; I did. HE's home, safe, and very happy. The arguments in my favour: I have job and have had the same one since July 2001 (she has never held a job longer than 2 months); I have a car for steady transportation (she walks everywhere); I have a clean criminal record (she's had warrants for her arrest as recently as last month); I live in a solid dwelling and have since April 30, 2001 (she's hopped everywhere from boyfriends' trailers and apts to her grandparent's house to the homeless shelter and hotels, averaging a stay of three weeks); I've got steady health insurance for myself and Mikey (she can only get Medicaid, which don't covah sheeyit).

The topper? I'm 28 and she's (get this) 34, soon to be 35.

My lawyer also asked the judge to appoint a Guardian Ad Litem to the case to investigate on my standing and hers as well, which the judge granted. THe G.A.L. will check out my home, workplace, friends, coworkers, and everything they can about me, as well as the same for her. On this issue, she's MEAT.

The judgment yesterday granting me temporary custody, in combination with the inevitable Guardian Ad Litem investigation(s), and her confrontational attitude (she tried to argue with the judge!) will assure a victory that only the POC has seen the likes of.

And let's add the growing influence of Ben on Talossan politics by way of EM200 and his Black Hand party.

The esteemed Dan Lorentz and Ben Madison have known each other since they were about fourteen years of age. This pre-dates Ián Metáiriâ, Gary Cone, and Art Verbotten's place in Ben's life. On 21 June 2004 and on the Kingdom's Wittenberg discussion forum, created by Kingdom citizen Pete Hottelet in the week following our independence, Lorentz announced the creation of the "One Talossa" political party. The party's Credo deserves a look.

There are now two Talossas.

In the Kingdom lie Talossa's original spark and genius, its deepest roots and its mighty and sustaining trunk of history and experience.

In the Republic flows much of Talossa's creative force and new growth.

Talossa's roots have lost their vitality; Talossa's vitality has severed itself from its roots.

In two, Talossa will die twice.

There is one great and urgent task for the two Talossas: become one again.

As one, Talossa may yet see another 25 years.

The first four sentences are a perfect summation of the magnitude of the breach Talossa finds herself in today. But this I must say, and I do say it: we who are Talossa's vitality severed ourselves from the roots of history and experience because we found out the hard way just how fouled Talossa's roots had become. Many who left before us Founding Parents realized this already: Ián Anglatzarâ, Phil Ledgerwood, Bill Cooper, Art Verbotten, Miestra Schivâ, and so many others.

Will Talossa die twice? The Kingdom has had a modest influx of new citizens thanks to slackened immigration requirements. One of these is Fritz Buchholtz, proprietor of Napoleon's game store in Shorewood (north of Atatürk province and in the Republic's territory of Shorewood Bay). His participation has given the Kingdom a shot in the arm, but this is also a sad time for the Kingdom: Napoleon's is closing and going out of business in spring of 2005 after twenty-six years in business. While people will be able to purchase games and supplies on the Internet and elsewhere, the community that has grown around Napoleon's will never be replaced.

The Republic is also gaining new prospectives and citizens, yet we suffer from the lack of connection with the local friendship network inherent in the crowd in Milwaukee. At this writing, the citizens of the Republic represent much of the cybercit history of the Kingdom. Former Kingdom Prime Ministers Chris Gruber, Michael Pope, and Gödafrïeu Válcadác'h whose combined service began in 1998 and had its final ending on 1 January, 2004 are among the citizens of this Republic, as are two former Kingdom Secretaries of State: Ián Anglatzarâ and Martì-Páir Furxhéir. There are people in the Republic whose memories of Talossa go all the way back to 1997. Every citizen of the Republic save one, Art Verbotten, found Talossa on the Internet. And this is a key difference between the Kingdom and the Republic: the Kingdom citizens are more Milwaukee-centric than they have been in years, and the Republic represents much of Cybercit Talossa.

Which begs the question: Do Cybercit Talossa and Milwaukee Talossa need each other? From reading the One Talossa Party Credo, one should think the answer would be a resounding "yes". But in its light, we need to hold our horses for a bit and remember *why* there are two Talossas in the first place. Those are reasons I have spent pages and pages outlining to you, and they can be boiled down to a single sentence: Ben Madison, the Tyrant, made himself unbearable to be around.

When I could no longer say in good conscience to a prospective the Kingdom of Talossa was a worthwhile pursuit, the Talossan life I knew and had was over; it was my turning point, and it took place on Black Tuesday.

Ben and Amy have shown how they treat those who cross them. They may just come looking for dirt on *you*. But, I say this, and I beg all who read to listen and take heed. Simply for the reason that it's the right thing to do, we cannot let Ben and Amy stand in the way of our friendships with good people like Gary Cone, Quedéir Castiglhâ, Dan Lorentz, and so many others. and Tomás Gariçéir...

el glelþ... The one thing on which the two countries agree wholeheartedly is the need for the glelþ to thrive and grow. Qator Itríns, Miestrâ Schivâ's monthly compendium of articles on all-matters-Republic Talossan, has been a boon for the language in that her monthly editor's column comes in both English and Talossan! Not since Støtanneu of many, many years ago was published solely in Talossan have we seen so much of el glelþ in a Talossan media publication.

#### Our Republic

What are we doing wrong, and what are we doing right? (Warning: the following section is G-rated:)

#### Grace

In keeping the Republic from one day splitting at the seams as the Kingdom did, it means giving someone the benefit of a doubt. Of course, avoiding the need to have grace in this sense is the best policy, and looking at one's self to find one's own mistakes is key for things working between us within Talossa and in our "real" lives. For example, the Council for Talossan Unity naming fiasco was defused once D. N. Vercáriâ realized the honest mistakes he made -- and everyone decided it was not as big an issue as they thought. Such a conciliatory and gracious gesture is alien to Ben Madison.

#### Glelþ

The Republic is on the right track here. We must give credit where credit is due: the language, besides the community he founded, is Ben Madison's legacy to the world. We must continue to show that making the language grow and letting some of its most enthusiastic participants involve themselves in its development and growth is paramount to its survival. And for the language to survive, there must be but *one* Glelþ, not two balkanized dialects (Republic and Kingdom).

#### Government

A body of laws devoid of loopholes and legalistic time-bombs will keep things running smoothly. We need to do a good job at keeping up with our citizens more often than just at election time. Where and when Real Life permits, it is the right and duty of every citizen of this country to, at minimum, keep up with what's going on in society, government, politics, language development, and what-not.

Delegation of authority and empowered deputies are musts. Without these, the Republic is vulnerable to circumstances such as those in my life and my response to them that helped to bring down the Válcadác'h Coalition. Deputies and delegation will reduce burnout, create harmony, and make things run like clockwork. Every minister and government official needs at least one deputy ready to take over when needed. Especially the Secretary of State...

By way of the development of a permanent Constitution, the Republic has taken giant steps forward in providing its citizenry with an elegant and concise body of fundamental law. A big part of this is the organized archiving of our laws and statutes. The National and Provisional Registers and the Mitchell Codex is a model for how the archiving of our laws could work. Before the Cybercit era began in 1996, this sort of thing was something the Kingdom did extremely well. The Cybercit Era led to a false sense of security: "It's okay. It's on the hard drive and web server." Paper doesn't crash, and having multiple archives of things does not hurt.

#### Gathering

The gathering of new people must always be a priority. Current Immigration Minister Ián Anglatzarâ (and Andy Lowry before him) is a model for future Immigration Ministers. He is a tireless advocate for prospectives, keeps the citizenry informed, and perhaps most-importantly, ensures that prospectives' first impression of the Republic is efficient -- yet lightheartedly friendly.

Besides, we need new blood all the time because even in the best of times, people become bored with Talossa and, like Mike Dinitz in the Kingdom, want to move on with their lives and say goodbye.

This, of course, brings up the issue of competition with *el Regipäts*. Will prospectives choose the Republic or the Kingdom? Both countries agree on this much: no one may do both at once.

#### Geekness

If this week Martì-Páir Furxhéir is abducted by aliens, how will we get by?

#### Gab

The Madison-vs-Gruber war was one of words (combined with a few actions from Ben, of course) that hurt people. We don't want that to ever become the *modus operandi* of our Republic. Yet, we don't want the Republic, either through culture or through direct government intervention, to stifle free speech and language in the paranoid fear someone might become *offended*. We in the Republic need to be tolerant in a way Ben never was: having the ability to disagree with someone about sensitive topics like euthanasia, abortion, and Iraq while still maintaining communication and camaraderie.

We are doing a decent job already in the Republic, and we need to keep it up!

## Reunification?

"In two, Talossa will die twice. There is one great and urgent task for the two Talossas: become one again." Can this ever happen?

Perhaps there is hope, but for me, fulfilling this hope will be predicated partly on the following items, all of which are non-negotiable:

1. Appropriate punishment being meted out to Ben Madison and Amy Durnford for the digging-up and exposure of Gruber's petty criminal past and the using of same to make spurious charges against him, even if Gruber's worldwide


reputation was not damaged. If expulsion is not in the cards, keeping the Royals royal and stripping them of all political and constitutional powers would be a good thing.

2. The unconditional acceptance of every single Republic citizen and prospective into the Kingdom. The rejection of even one person negates the entire thing. Of course, this would probably only fly in the Republic with unanimous consent from every citizen, including Chris Gruber. I do not see this happening any time in the near future.

Since 1 June 2004, Ben has not given me any reason to believe he would ever accept these conditions. I also believe his iron grip on the Kingdom's reins of power will never be loosened enough to force him to.

And as time goes on, the Republic and Kingdom will continue to forge their own traditions and culture. Already, the Kingdom bears little resemblance to the Kingdom we once knew. I see much more of an ad-hoc atmosphere: witness the ease with which any prospective may obtain citizenship in the Regipäts without having to be screened by Cort or Ziu. This is also due in part to the changes in its Internet presence and the increased Milwaukee-centeredness of the King. I do not believe Ben has ever really been comfortable with Talossa on the Internet, and that he, for the time being, will not look there for new growth If he had his way, I think he would want every new citizen from now on to be from the greater Milwaukee area.

Which brings us to our connection with...





...and how much it should be a part of who we are and what we do as Talossans...

To have a Talossa without the East Side of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, would be to have a nationette that should not bear the name *Talossa*. One of the great appeals of the Kingdom to me was the local old-growth network of Madison-Cone-Metáiriâ-Verbotten, etc. It added to the Regipäts a centeredness and sense of deep-rooted community I loved dearly. A problem and handicap we have in the Republic is that when we seceded, we elected to cut ourselves off from a great deal of this network, the only remnant of which that we have now being in the person of Art Verbotten.

Happily, the Republic consensus is in resounding favor of keeping as much of Milwaukee and our roots as possible. There are some questions, still. How much of the Berber things do we keep? What about the Kingdom-created names of provincial cantons and cities?

And what about our TalossaFest, or whatever we end up calling it?

All of these questions will be answered, and I am happy to report for posterity that everyone in the Republic is concerned about all these issues and are at the very least talking about these things.
